## Scouts Signs

Scouts around the nation have used Lark Label to make custom outdoor signs for their service projects. As you are planning your project, let these examples inspire your ideas!

**Black Walnut**  
*Juglans nigra*  
 Fabaceae  
 Height: 75' - 100'  
 Spread: 75' - 100'




The Black Walnut grows mostly in riparian zones. The wood is commercially used because of its deep brown color and can be easily worked with. Black Walnut nuts are edible and shelled commercially in the United States. It is used in ice cream, bakery goods and confections.

7" x 5" Classic Marker

- Use smaller markers to identify plants and historical elements. Educational signs are generally larger, used to explain a bigger concepts. Donor & Memorial signs are used to honor your beneficiary show your pride and take credit for the project.
- Classic Markers are laser etched black aluminum. They are great for text, simple graphics and QR codes. Mount them on a stake or a bench.
- Spectrum full color signs are a plastic composite. Use these for photos, complicated graphics and attention getting color.

**A Legacy of Leadership**

Albert Winslow Dodge, fondly known to family and friends as "Al", displayed a dedication to community affairs that continued until shortly before his passing at the age of 100. With a lifelong commitment to service, Al served the Town of Wenham in several positions involving local government, education, and the environment. Starting in the 1950's, Al was instrumental in the formation of the Hamilton-Wenham Regional School District and in the construction of the Regional High School in 1961. In 1971, he was elected to the Wenham Board of Selectmen, serving for 12 years.

Al also served as the longest elected Tree Warden in the state of Massachusetts, holding the position for 53 years. With his determined personality and passion for the betterment of the town, Al identified future town needs and made important projects happen when others could not. Al's reputation among property owners and extensive knowledge of all town properties made him the "go-to person" for locating new building projects in Hamilton and Wenham. Understanding the importance of open land and the environment, Al was instrumental in advocating for the purchase of the Iron Rail property by Town in 1974, a site that continues to benefit the residents of Wenham. Along with his wife Betty, Al was involved and participated in many other community initiatives over the years.


Al and Betty were also active and beloved members of the First Church in Wenham. Al became a member in 1941 and served as a Trustee from 1948 to 1961, overseeing the major addition of the Parish Construction Project in 1952. With great joy the congregation celebrated his 100th birthday in May of 2014. Al's lifelong dedication to town affairs and his visionary leadership left a legacy of service for all to follow.

**The Green Frog**  
*Lithobates clamitans*

Green frogs hatch from eggs as tadpoles. Over the course of 1-3 years, tadpoles gradually mature into adult frogs through metamorphosis. During metamorphosis, tadpoles lose their swimming tails and gain four legs, along with the ability to leave the water for a short time.

Range: Eastern USA and Canada  
 Habitat: Small, shallow ponds and lakes  
 Size: 2-4 inches in length  
 Color: Green, Brown, and Grey  
 Diet: Small animals such as crickets, spiders, minnows, and shrimp

### Is Your Dog Hydrated and Cool?

**Symptoms of Dehydration**

- ◆ Dry Nose and Mouth
- ◆ Thick Drool
- ◆ Heavy Panting
- ◆ Sunken Eyes
- ◆ Hot Skin with Little Elasticity
- ◆ Weakness in Legs
- ◆ Vomiting, Diarrhea or Loss of Appetite
- ◆ Change in Attitude
- ◆ Changed Attitude
- ◆ Producing Dark Urine

**DID YOU KNOW:**  
Dogs should drink somewhere between 1/2 to 1 ounce of water per 10 lbs. of body weight the dog has per day under normal conditions.

**TREATMENT:**  
If you notice that your dog is panting and seems to be growing tired, allow your dog to rest in a cool environment and **slowly** give them **cool**, not cold, water. You can also fan them, but **do not apply ice** because this will constrict their blood vessels.

However, if you are in doubt or your dog starts to show more symptoms of either overheating and/or dehydration, **TAKE YOUR DOG TO YOUR VETERINARIAN IMMEDIATELY.**

Heat-related illnesses and dehydration can be **leady** and require the knowledge and equipment that only a veterinarian has.

**Symptoms of Overheating**

- ◆ Panting
- ◆ Heavy Breathing
- ◆ Bright Red or Blue Gums
- ◆ Weakness in Legs
- ◆ Vomiting or Diarrhea
- ◆ Collapsing
- ◆ Seizing
